

# What is Student Specific Corrective Action (SSCA)?

The Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) found that some CPS policies in 2016-17 and 2017-18 caused delays and denials of special education services for some students. SSCA is the mandated CPS program that offers opportunities to families to remedy those lapses in services.

## What is CPS offering impacted families?

CPS is offering money remedies up to \$4,000 per school year (2016-17 and/or 2017-18), depending on how a student was impacted.

CPS Identified Area	Remedy (per year)
Extended School Year (ESY)	\$800
Transportation	\$1,250
Paraprofessional services	\$2,000
Specific Learning Disability (SLD)	\$4,000
Budget-related delays	\$2,000

## What's Next?

I received a claim notice, what do I need to do?

- Go to [www.cps-ssca.com](http://www.cps-ssca.com) and enter your Claim Number and PIN.
- Review the information and accept the money, decline the money, or ask for an SSCA meeting (where a team will consider whether your child is owed more money).
- If you accept the money, decide how you want to receive it and then sign the waiver.
- The deadline to accept the money remedy is April 30, 2022.

## I did not receive a claim notice but think my child should get a remedy. What should I do?

You can request an SSCA meeting where a team will review your child's records and talk with you to determine if your child is eligible. Email [ssca@cps.edu](mailto:ssca@cps.edu) or call 773-553-1843 to request a meeting.
