JANUARY 20, 2025 - DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. DAY



Celebrating the Life and Legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was a pivotal figure in the American Civil Rights Movement, advocating for equality and justice for African Americans. His powerful words and nonviolent activism continue to inspire generations worldwide.

Early Life and Education

Born on January 15, 1929, in Atlanta, Georgia, Martin Luther King Jr. was the son of a Baptist minister. He grew up in a time of racial segregation and discrimination, which deeply influenced his life's work. King excelled academically, skipping grades in high school and entering Morehouse College at the age of 15. He later pursued theological studies at Crozer Theological Seminary and Boston University, earning a doctorate in systematic theology.

The Rise of a Leader

In 1954, at the age of 25, King became the pastor of Dexter Avenue Baptist Church in Montgomery, Alabama. His leadership in the Montgomery Bus Boycott, sparked by Rosa Parks' refusal to give up her seat on a bus, catapulted him into the national spotlight. The boycott, lasting over a year, successfully led to the desegregation of Montgomery's bus system and established King as a prominent leader in the fight for civil rights.

Nonviolent Resistance and Social Change

King's philosophy of nonviolent resistance, inspired by Mahatma Gandhi, became the cornerstone of the Civil Rights Movement. He organized and participated in numerous protests, marches, and sit-ins, advocating for an end to racial segregation and discrimination. His powerful speeches, such as the iconic "I Have a Dream" speech delivered during the March on Washington in 1963, resonated with millions and galvanized support for the cause. AWARDED CONTRACTS HIGHLIGHT





A notable feature of this contract is IBM's strong commitment to supplier innovation, with 30% participation by Minority-Owned Business Enterprises (MBE) and 10% by Women-Owned Business Enterprises (WBE). This aligns with Chicago Public Schools' strategic plan Success 2029: We Rise Together.

This initiative will strengthen Chicago Public Schools' effectiveness, productivity, and service capacity, further empowering the District to provide more nimbleness and responsiveness to the needs for the students, staff, and the communities we serve.

- 2. Bake Flour in oven, stirring occasionally until
- 3. Mix brown flour and oil in a sauce pan and continue to cook for approximately 20 minutes, or until roux is dark brown
- 4. Excess brown roux can be stored for several weeks in the refrigerator
